In times of uncertainty, one thing remains clear: investing in our community is the most powerful way to shape a better future. As we navigate a world that continues to shift and surprise us, Hawai'i Island United Way (HIUW) is responding with purpose and heart.

In our April newsletter, I shared what we learned from listening sessions with over 100 supporters, nonprofit partners, staff, volunteers, and board members. Mahalo to everyone who contributed! Now, we're excited to share how we're turning that feedback into action by launching the HIUW Hawai'i Island Nonprofit Network.

Community Impact Grants

We currently distribute about \$18,000 per month in grants to nonprofit partners serving communities across Hawai'i Island. Our goal is to increase that to \$24,000 per month in the 2026–2028 grant cycle–amplifying the reach and impact of local organizations.

Program Incubator

Many grassroots groups have powerful ideas but need support to bring them to life. Our Program Incubator offers space in our Kino'ole Street office and connects new initiatives with local professionals. Our first project? A mini furniture bank! Family Support Hawai'i: Fatherhood Initiative

"During my divorce, I was recommended to attend the Fatherhood Initiative. Initially, I was hesitant. Struggling with some social anxiety and feeling like I already knew what it took to be a good father, I almost skipped my first meeting. However, after meeting the group, hearing their stories-both the struggles and the successes-I quickly recognized the value of being part of a community of men, a comradery, committed to becoming better fathers and better men. That was nearly five years ago. In addition to parenting skills, I've also learned how to be a better co-parent with my children's mother. Many of the topics discussed address the dynamics of both parentswhether they're together or not. Through the Fatherhood Initiative, I've gained tools for communicating productively with her, despite our differences and past grievances. I'm deeply grateful for the Fatherhood Initiative, the many men who have shared their insight at the meetings."
