PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

PRESIDENT & CPO, JESS THOMPSON

Aloha Friends,

I began serving as your President and CPO at Hawai'i Island United Way on December 3, 2024, and I began drafting this message to you on March 3, 2025. I'm excited to share the insights I've gathered during the past three months. I've had the privilege of speaking with over 100 current and former staff, volunteers, board members, community partners, and donors, and I want to highlight some key takeaways.

The future is uncertain. No matter their political affiliation or life experience, people shared that the rapid pace of change leaves many unsure of what lies ahead. In light of this uncertainty, the importance of Hawai'i Island United Way's mission–to unite people, organizations, and resources–has never been clearer.

Our mission stands strong after 6 decades, and as I heard time and again from those I spoke with, it's vital now more than ever to bring people together. Our work is appreciated, and many expressed a desire to contribute more–whether it's time, funds, or insights. People shared that they would like to see growth in our volunteer base, board, staff, community impact grant programs, and nonprofit convenings. More than anything, people stated HIUW was uniquely positioned to uplift the successes -- and challenges -- of Hawai'i Island nonprofit staff and organizations who work tirelessly to meet the needs of our community members who call Hawai'i Island home.

American Red Cross Hawaii

In August 2024, a family of five in Pahoa experienced a home fire that deemed their home destroyed as a result. The family was immediately given \$875 in financial assistance. They unfortunately lost many personal items and worked with Red Cross caseworkers to gain access to critical resources, such as eyeglass prescription vouchers. They also worked with caseworkers to identify agencies to contact, like the social security office, DMV and how to retain a new passport. The consistent reassurance and support from caseworkers enabled the family to quickly begin their road to recovery despite the tragic home fire.

Lily A. (name changed for privacy) is a 6-year-old girl who lives with her mother. Lily's family was referred to Parents, Inc. services to prevent Child Welfare intervention. After the home assessment, it was noted that Lily lacked essential hygiene items that would improve her overall physical health. Her Parents, Inc. case manager requested funds (\$50.00) to purchase hygiene items. The Friends was able to provide the funding (\$50.00). The case manager reported that Lily used the products to keep herself clean and healthy. She also noted a positive impact on Lily's self-esteem and social behavior.
